There is a Phil Jackson quote that sums up basketball, "The strength of the team is each individual member. The strength of each member is the team." It also describes team ARCA.



# ARCA’s Traveling Theater Troupe

ARCA’s Traveling Theater Troupe was founded in June, 2013 and today includes a dozen talented actors, writers and singers. Originally, the Troupe collaborated with the spectacular Sol Acting Academy to learn the complex aspects of theater production, but it wasn’t long before they decided to undertake a full scale performance of their own.

Our Troupe is driven by the actors and from the beginning they wanted to perform original works. Their first script, *Challenges*, was a hit with audiences near and far. *Challenges* depicted personal difficulties encountered in their daily lives and words like “WOW” and “POWERFUL” are tame descriptors of the message. *Challenges* was performed throughout Albuquerque in venues including Heights Community Center Performing Space, Adelante Performing Theater, Sol Acting Academy, House of Memories, the Center for Self-Advocacy and Paloma Blanca Nursing Home. Every time an encore performance was requested, the actors would respond, “The show must go on!”

Marshall Performing Arts Conservatory was a wonderful collaborator and their drama experts Christie and Linnea provided our emergent ARCA actors with an advanced education. Within six weeks, they wrote, rehearsed and performed a new play *A Walk Down Hollywood Boulevard* at the African American Arts Performance Theater.

One actor told me she only wanted a small role in *A Walk Down Hollywood Boulevard*. She did not feel confident in her ability to express herself in front of strangers. When extenuating circumstances arose, she was asked to perform a major role and, although not overwhelmingly happy about the request, agreed to try. *A Walk Down Hollywood Boulevard* was performed in July



at the African American Performing Arts Theater and was sensational! While mingling during the cast party, this proud actor told me, “I didn’t think I could do it, but I did. I am now really ready for Hollywood. Thank you for giving me the chance.”



The Traveling Theater Group decided to venture into the too familiar topic of bullying and wrote and produced *Taming the Bully*. It was beautifully and delicately crafted so the audience would appreciate the power of kindness. The opening performance at The Fusion Theater was a smash. The actors journeyed throughout Albuquerque sharing this story and audiences ranged from Head Start children to seniors in Nursing Homes.

With their skills further honed, the Troupe was ready for a new challenge. *The Wizard of Oz* continued the theme of bullying and peer pressure with familiar characters from the Wizard of Oz. Stephen Villella took on the role of Assistant Director and created a sensitive drama with extraordinary costumes, scenery and special effects including a tornado.

The ARCA Traveling Theater Troupe continues to share their messages of diversity, hope and kindness throughout Albuquerque and, in the process, learn about themselves, sharpen their abilities and grow as self-determined citizens in our society. # Mobile Vision Clinic

Thanks to the dedicated support of Dr. Larry and the generosity of VSP, ARCA has been selected as the recipient of the VSP Mobile Eyes program - three days of eye care, including glasses, at no cost for eligible staff.

VSP Mobile Eyes grew from relief efforts following Hurricanes Katrina and Rita in 2005. Today, VSP Mobile Eyes includes three mobile eye care clinics that feature exam rooms with the latest technology, dispensaries with popular frame brands donated by Marchon Eyewear and Altair Eyewear, UNITY® lenses donated by VSP Optics Group and finishing labs to make glasses on-site. Working in partnership with VSP providers who volunteer their time and expertise, patients receive comprehensive eye exams and, if needed, glasses.

When not helping in times of disaster, VSP’s fully funded mobile eye care clinics travel to communities across North America. ARCA is grateful to have such skilled optometrists providing exemplary care for staff who have dedicated their own lives to the care of others.

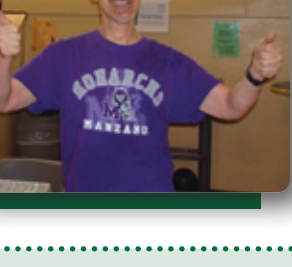

Circle of Supports

Circle of Supports is a new project of the New Mexico Department of Health designed to create greater independence for people on the DD Waiver waiting list. ARCA is jazzed to have been selected by the State to deliver these supports in the Albuquerque Metro Region.



With the help of ARCA employees called Community Guides, these remarkable young people ages 18 - 25 make friends, find resources and develop natural supports in the community. The first step is to facilitate a My Star meeting - a fun, personal planning process in which the individual, family and friends discuss their dreams and aspirations both vocationally and for leisure time. After the My Star is completed, individuals begin their adventures in the community by participating in activities they have chosen.

Participants and family members are giving Circle of Supports rave reviews. One participant was so thrilled when staff arrived at his home he jumped up and down, smiling and shouting, “ARCA is here! ARCA is here!” Participants are enjoying meaningful activities including volunteer work with animals, applying for jobs and attending classes. Most importantly, they are gaining confidence in their own ability to become more independent.

This project is currently funded through June 30, 2015.

We appreciate the opportunity to facilitate this worthwhile project and see joy on the faces of these young adults as they gain independence each and every day!
