



Yet, an employee survey conducted by the Albuquerque Journal resulted in ARCA being named among the Top Five Workplace (Large Business) in New Mexico. In a world of perceived

## The Albuquerque Journal Names ARCA a Winner of the New Mexico 2017 Top Workplaces Award





ARCA has been awarded a 2017 Top Workplaces honor by The Albuquerque Journal. The Top Workplaces lists are based solely on the results of an employee feedback survey administered by WorkplaceDynamics, LLC, a leading research firm that specializes in organizational health and workplace improvement. Several aspects of workplace culture were measured, including alignment, execution and connection.

"The Top Workplaces award is not a popularity contest. Oftentimes, people assume it's all about fancy perks and benefits," says Doug Claffey, CEO of WorkplaceDynamics. "But to be a Top Workplace, organizations must meet our

strict standards for organizational health. Who better to ask about work life than the people who live the culture every day—the employees. Time and time again, our research has proven that what's most important to them is a strong belief in where the organization is headed, how it's going to get there, and the feeling that everyone is in it together." Claffey adds, "Without this sense of connection, an organization doesn't have a shot at being named a Top Workplace."

"ARCA is thrilled to be named among the top five workplaces in New Mexico," said Edward J. Kaul, ARCA President/CEO. "Every day we provide direct support for nearly 700 infants through seniors with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This award is a reflection of our staff - the people who knowledgably provide support with respect, dignity and always a sense of joy. Our staff is ARCA." Edward Kaul also received a special award for leadership of a large company.


## **Up with People's 2017 World Tour**
