
Circle of Promise

Tinkerbell

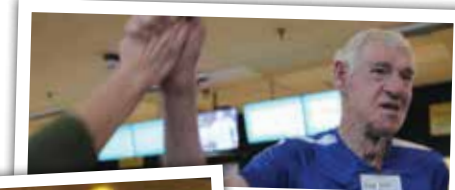

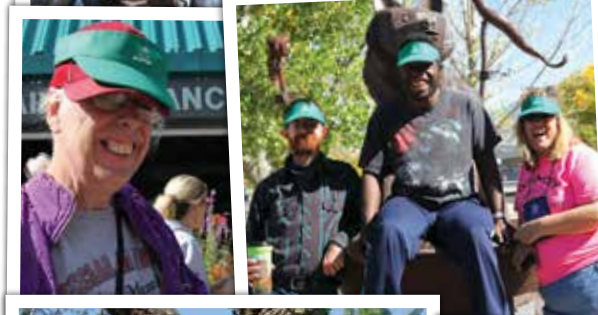
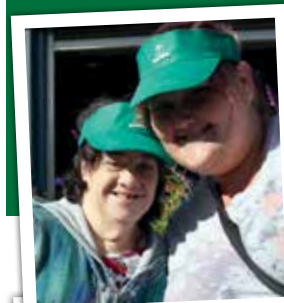
Special Olympics

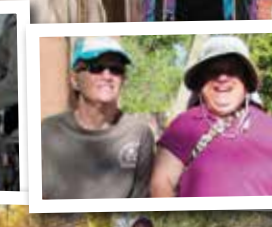

CIMS is the first consensus-based management standard that outlines the primary characteristics of a successful, quality cleaning organization. As a certified janitorial training facility, we can offer people with ABI the resources to acquire job readiness skills and become part of our team.

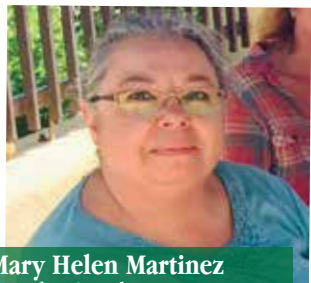
