STAFF SPOTLIGHT

Eligio inspires people he supports, families and peers to never let a challenge interfere with a dream. Eligio began his career with ARCA 26 years ago. Although he enjoyed his job as Chef of the historic Conchas Lodge, he wanted to return to Albuquerque. A friend suggested ARCA. Reflecting on those early days, Eligio recalls, "I was really scared. I thought I would work at ARCA until I found a job in my field. But after I got over the shock of learning something brand new, I wanted to stay!"

Eligio makes a difference in people's lives. Bob is nonverbal, but when Eligio realized he knew limited sign language he found a program where Bob could further develop this skill. He incorporated practice sessions into the home routine and found an ASL interpreter to attend and translate medical appointments. Today, Bob can communicate his thoughts and understand others. When Joey turned 50, it was culturally significant to host his entire family

in a celebration. Eligio invited Joey's family and planned a menu of traditional foods. When the day arrived, 50+ relatives, staff and individuals celebrated Joey's milestone day together. Eligio understands the importance of family. When Felix shared how desperately he wanted a family to visit for the holidays, Eligio and other staff invited him to spend the holidays with their families. But, Felix wanted his own. With Eligio's support, two close community partners welcomed Felix into their lives. To this day, he calls them mom and dad.

When asked how ARCA changed from a job to a career, he replied, "The individuals are so honest and appreciative. I see "I can do that" in their eyes. I feel like I make a difference and I'm needed and appreciated. I remember feeling very welcomed from the start and I have great staff relationships. I have received wonderful



support from my supervisors who have taught me so much!"

Eligio came to ARCA timid and unsure of his future, but through dedicated service and hard work developed the confidence and skills to advocate for people he supports, even when others might not initially believe they can succeed. Along the way, we have all benefited from Eligio's belief in the power within us all.

I Wish You Joy

Khalil Gibran said, "I slept and dreamed that life is all joy. I woke and saw that life is all service. I served and saw that service is joy." I was fortunate to find ARCA in my early 20s. I had a Bachelor of Business Administration and a few years' experience as a VISTA volunteer and program planner when my sister suggested I come to Albuquerque for a visit. About the same time, ARCA was selected as a pilot program to model community based services for adults with developmental disabilities. Since ARCA was hiring and I needed an income, I accepted a job as a direct support professional. It didn't take long to know ARCA was my new home.

In 1987, parents and guardians of 21 people with developmental disabilities filed the Jackson Lawsuit to address violations of the Rehabilitation Act; people with severe disabilities were subjected to discrimination and segregation. While this lawsuit has become the longest in New Mexico history, the immediate outcome was to close institutions and integrate services into our community. ARCA welcomed the opportunity to bring people from institutions into our community based model of service. Across the country, many struggled with the notion of having people, historically segregated, suddenly living as neighbors; but, Albuquerqueans opened their arms and hearts as if to say, "where have you been all this time?"

As my responsibilities at ARCA increased, my deep regard for the compassion, innovation and spirit of our workforce also grew. These traits have remained culturally ingrained as ARCA evolved into serving hundreds of children and adults with severe medical, behavioral and cognitive needs in community settings. Today, we support nearly 700 people in living a life of maximum independence. We have over 50 little ones who come to us each year through CYFD who are wrapped in the safe, loving arms of ARCA foster families. More than 250 adults who would once have been relegated to institutions are living full lives because of the acute 24/7 care they receive in ARCA's Supported Living, Family Based and InterCare homes. In our Independent Living Program, 77 individuals work, live and recreate with a focus to always give back to our community. Hundreds of people thrive in our Career Enhancement, Supported Employment, Respite, Prader-Willi Syndrome, Health and Wellness, Smart Living and, most recently, Acquired Brain Injury Programs.

I am proud of ARCA and the dedicated services we provide.

I've known joyful dreams and service. Today, I understand true service is the heart of a joyful life. During this holiday season and throughout the upcoming year, I wish you and yours much joy.

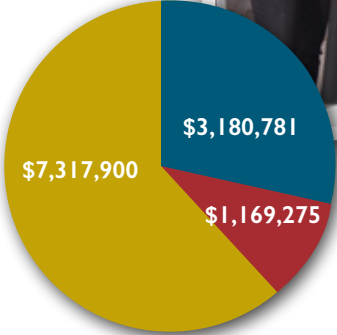
The Best is Yet to Come

In 2015, David graduated from high school and transitioned into ARCA's Supported Employment Services. During his first visit, he shared his goal of someday becoming a teacher. Staff researched New Mexico licensing requirements and explained David would need to invest a tremendous amount of time and effort before he could work with children. David was all in! He accepted a job at Goodwill to pay his bills while he attended CNM. It took three years for David to complete the necessary certifications to become a teacher's assistant. He applied for a position at La Petite Academy and has been a stellar employee for two years, where he ensures the 20 children in his classroom eat their snacks and lunch, safely enjoy recess and he designs and supervises one craft project each week. David's job coach helps him develop visual sheets to use during lunch and snack times and a roll call to ensure each student is accounted for at all times. Several months ago one of David's co-workers was promoted to Lead Teacher. He spoke with his manager about his own opportunities for promotion and learned he would have to return to CNM to complete extensive coursework. His manager not only said he had confidence David could succeed, but offered to pay his tuition. Today, David works as a Teacher's Assistant in the afternoon and is taking two classes toward his certification to become a Lead Teacher. When we think about miracles, we sometimes imagine they come prepackaged, wrapped in a bow. More often, it is someone's belief in us that allows the miracle to blossom. ARCA's Green Team

With three large office buildings and homes throughout Albuquerque, ARCA's Green Team embodies the Spirit of Going Green by learning and sharing information about how to best support our environment. The Green Team has employed this spirit in a number of agency-wide initiatives, including battery recycling, purchasing portable recycling containers for use at community events and establishing recycling areas at ARCA locations.



Recently, members of ARCA's Green Team, including persons served and ARCA employees, made a trip to Friedman Recycling Center to learn more about Albuquerque's recycling capabilities. Did you know electromagnets, air jets and weight sorters are all used to separate types of recyclables? Or that it takes more water to make new plastic than it does to rinse and recycle existing plastic? Here are a few tips that have been shared with ARCA staff and individuals served:

- Recyclables that are not properly rinsed often contaminate other recycling and will end up in the land fill.
 - Used pizza boxes or other greasy cardboard fall into this category.
 - Cleaning bottles should be rinsed three times.
- Plastic bags cannot be recycled here, as they get stuck in the sorting machine and halt the process until they can be cleaned out. The only time it is appropriate to put plastic bags in your city recycling bin is when they are full of shredded paper. Workers on the line can easily recognize and pick out the bag, tear it open to empty the shredded paper onto the line and throw the bag away.
