Since 1957, ARCA has provided stellar, life-long supports for people with intellectual, developmental and cognitive disabilities. In New Mexico, the transition of people moving from institutional to community based living brought new benefits to our community through vocational, recreational and educational opportunities. The one constant during this decades long journey has been to embrace change.

COVID-19 changed the very core of ARCA's model of service. With a strong history of "looking out," stay at home orders have required we adjust to "looking in." Innovative staff and strong leadership have found ways to continue to ensure the health, safety and happiness of individuals served, staff and families.

This year we saw our legislature appropriate a portion of the funding shortages documented in the State's 2019 Rate Study to supplement gaps in reimbursement rates. The special session, in response to the economic impact of COVID-19, scaled back state spending by about \$600 million. We don't know, yet, what the impact will be on ARCA.

These challenging times impact each of us, but together we will continue our journey. As Albert Einstein wrote, "Life is like riding a bicycle, to keep your balance, you must keep moving."

As always, we remain grateful for the patience, support and leadership of our community.

# AT HOME:

- **78 individuals** were assisted in realizing their dreams of self-sufficiency and inclusion through ARCA's **Independent Living Program.**
- **97 individuals** in ARCA's **Supported Living Program** experienced optimum health and safety in a personalized environment while practicing self-sufficiency.
- 82 individuals received 24-hour care and support, including meaningful work at our greenhouses, designed to meet individual needs through ARCA's InterCare Program
- **196 infants, children and adults** received customized supports in family settings, including adoption, foster care, personal care, home-based support and respite through ARCA's **Family Based Services Program**.

# IN THE COMMUNITY:

- ARCA's Career Enhancement Services (ACES) and Supported Employment Services: The lives of 113 individuals were enriched through engagement in community activities, preemployment training and support to ensure their success after acquiring meaningful work in the community or fulfilling a dream of running their own business.
- ARCA's Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS) Project: 55 individuals, along with their families and key community members throughout New Mexico, received necessary supports to ensure the health and safety of individuals with this life-threatening genetic disorder.
- Health Matters Program: Through lessons in health, mentoring and participating in our walking club, **93 individuals** experienced improved health and well-being.

- Smart Living Program: 37 individuals received less than 24 hour supports, frequently incorporating mobile technology training and use, to realize maximum independence.
