CBIS Curriculum – The Certified Brain Injury Specialist training covers the following topics:

- TBI in pediatrics and adolescents, as well as aging with a brain injury
- Concussions and mTBI, as well as disorders of consciousness
- Rehabilitation philosophy, outcome measurement and care management
- Effect of injuries on families
- Cultural, gender and sexuality issues
- Military populations
- Neuropsychology
- Participation and return to work
