Children and adults served by ARCA live full lives in our community. This year, we've been especially excited about opening our doors to over 150 new children and adults.

We are so proud of our service areas! Over 400 children and adults live with housemates, independently or in a family setting. ARCA's Community Integrated Employment program worked with adults seeking employment and local area businesses to find meaningful careers for 35 people. Prader-Willi Syndrome Project staff traveled throughout New Mexico to ensure children and adults living with this life-threatening genetic disorder are living rich, safe lives in their communities. Community Services is now welcoming children into day programs! NeuRoads received the final licensure on an intake/assessment facility, offering five community residential facilities to support adults with an acquired brain injury.

Post-pandemic life was transitional, but staff successfully addressed concerns and adapted to changing service models to help individuals reintroduce into the community to work, play and learn.

Hundreds of friends and neighbors visited our greenhouses, buying beautiful plants and reconnecting with extraordinary gardeners. Local businesses made the holidays festive by hosting individuals without families for dinner and a visit with Santa at the Albuquerque Country Club. Leadership Sandoval worked for months to restore the beauty of our farm and make ongoing maintenance possible with limited staff. Over 1,000 people had a blast at our Bob Scanlon / Steve Mackie Bowl-a-Thon.

We are humbled by our community's warm welcome back into day-to-day life. We are reminded every day that the strength of our community defines ARCA and makes possible the glorious lives of people served.

In 2014, ARCA's Board and Membership Committee began formally recognizing distinguished leaders for their wisdom, intuitiveness and demonstrated ability to overcome seemingly insurmountable obstacles in realizing progress for people with intellectual, developmental and cognitive disabilities.

Elaine Solimon was recognized with ARCA's 2023 Award of Distinction. After volunteering with adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in high school, Elaine set her career path to working with this very special population. She dedicated her 40+ year career to ARCA, where in 1996, she was named ARCA's third Executive Director.



Throughout her career, Elaine embodied the principles of community integration, person-centered planning and inclusion. Under her leadership and during a time of rapid growth, Elaine initiated ARCA's Quality Journey and realized Quality New Mexico's Roadrunner Award. She worked closely with families in developing a Planned Giving Program and is a strong advocate for and member of ARCA's Circle of Promise. Her leadership, defined by compassion, keen decision making and open communication brought ARCA to the forefront of the industry.

Person-(entered Services



ARCA offered person-centered services in FYE 2024 for 576 individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities of varying ages, diagnoses and levels of need at home and in the community.

A R C A ARCA's residential supports provided the opportunity to live in a safe home independently, with housemates or in a family setting. 58 Opening Doors. adults realized self-sufficiency and inclusion through Customized In-Home Supports while 83 adults shared a home with people of similar interests in Supported Living. ARCA's InterCare program offered 24-hour care and support to

71 adults. Family Based Services offered customized supports to 196 children and adults in a family setting, including foster care and respite.

113 adults participated in ARCA's Customized Community Supports and Community Integrated Employment. Developmental Disabilities Nurses, Licensed Nutritionists and Registered Dietitians provided medical coordination and dietary plans for 266 adults.

ARCA's Prader-Willi program worked alongside 55 children and adults with this life-threatening genetic disorder throughout New Mexico.

To improve health and wellness, 144 adults learned about nutrition, exercise and the importance of preventative care and, along with their teammates, walked a total of 29,967.45 miles in the ARCA on the Move competition!

In FYE 2024, NeuRoads NM provided residential, outpatient and/or vocational supports for 17 adults with an acquired brain injury while working with their families to realize successful cognitive outcomes.

Within community homes, NeuRoads NM provided residential, cognitive functional rehabilitation services for 17 people, including program coordination, nursing and health promotion, supported employment, respite, recreation, individualized transportation, assistive technology and custom therapies.

NeuRoads NM supported 1 person with supported employment.


